



Vojislav Šešelj	Ante Gotovina
<ul> <li>participated in a JCE, and that the purpose of this JCE was the permanent forcible removal, through the commission of crimes, of a majority of the Croat, Muslim and other non- Serb populations from specific areas (including Kajina region)</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>participated in a JCE, the common purpose of which was the permanent removal of the Serb population from the Krajina region in Croatia by force.</li> </ul>
• the JCE came into existence before 1 August 1991 and Šešelj was a part of it until September 1993.	<ul> <li>Operation Storm ("Oluja") - launched on 4 August 1995 and last 3 days</li> </ul>




#### Ante Gotovina

- persecutions on political, racial or religious grounds, deportation, inhumane acts (forcible transfer) (crimes against humanity, Art. 5)
- plunder of public or private property (violations of the laws or customs of war, Art. 3)
- murder, torture, cruel treatment, wanton destruction of villages, or devastation not justified military necessity, destruction or wilful damage done to institutions dedicated to religion or education


- persecutions on political, racial or religious grounds, deportation, inhumane acts (forcible transfer) (crimes against humanity, Art. 5)
- plunder of public and private property, wanton destruction of cities, towns or villages or devastation not justified by military necessity (violations of the laws or customs of war, Art. 3)
- murder (Art 3 and 5)
- inhumane acts (Art 3)
- cruel treatment (Art 5)


