

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

- Important indicator for authorities in fight against corruption


Changes in corruption levels in the past three years



Perceived levels of corruption in key institutions




Corruption affecting key institutions/sectors, comparison over time

Increased since 2009




Why are bribes paid?


to speed things up (22%)

People's experiences with petty bribery, by service




No reduction in petty bribery levels in the last five years




Corruption Perception Index



Government's efforts to fight corruption remain ineffective




Government's effectiveness through regions




% of respondents reporting their government efforts to be effective/extremely effective

Whom do people trust the most to fight corruption in their country?




Are people willing to engage in the fight against corruption?
